



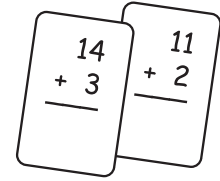
Math Facts Study Tips

Different math strategies work for different students. Help your child decide which strategies work best for him or her.

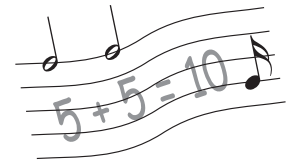
FLASH CARDS

Flash cards can be purchased in many stores and online. Students can also make their own flashcards—which adds another opportunity to practice the facts.



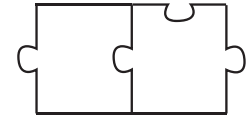
SONGS AND CHANTS

Help your child create songs and chants to remember math facts. Find music that your child likes and substitute the facts for the words to the songs.



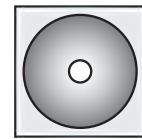
GAMES AND PUZZLES
